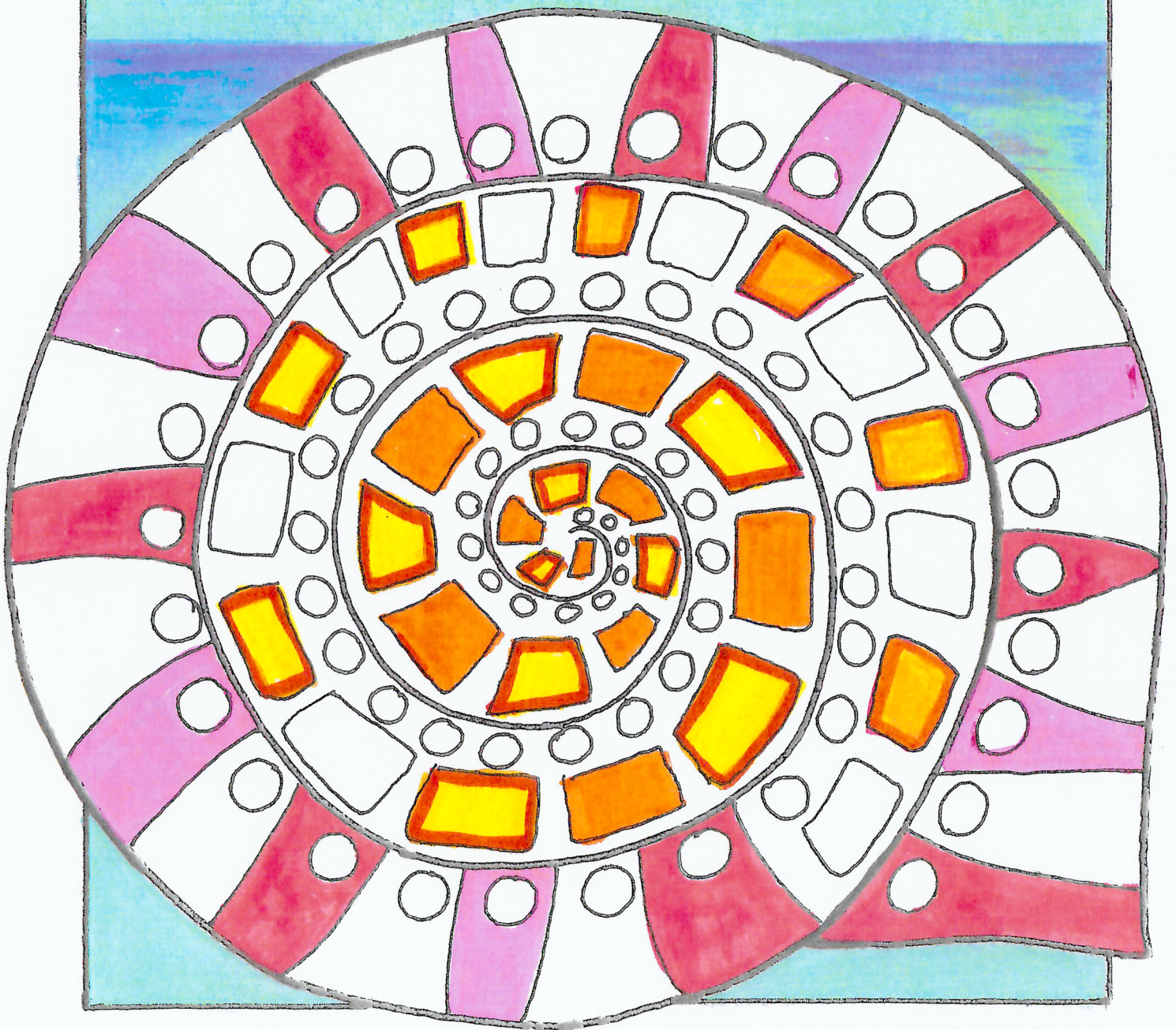

He is responsible for turning Rome from a republic to the Roman Empire Through wars and conquering other nations. Not a very friendly thing to do. However, he is also known for having a very warm heart towards Cleopatra. They were very friendly! Your Art Class can be warm and friendly in the month of July.

This lesson is about making round and sun shaped balloons. Copy one of the black and white drawings on card stock or draw your own. The challenge is to use shades of orange when adding color.

Then do the lesson again, but use red, white, and blue to add the patriotic colors. Happy July!

Music Suggestion: Try the album by Dizzy Gillespie titled “Dizzy Goes to Hollywood.” John Birks “Dizzy” Gillespie (1917-1993) is known for his be-bop and jazz. “Caesar and Cleopatra” theme song from the movie by the same name is on the album as well as theme songs from other movies. Great warm and friendly music to enjoy and inspire!

Enrichment: Contemporary artist, Erin Hanson, is known for “Open Impressionism” and has done some beautiful landscapes in orange called “The Orange Show.” Compare her work to that of Lord Frederic Leighton (1830-1895) who did “Flaming June” of a woman in an orange dress,

Aspect of Art: **Orange:** Secondary color that is the result of combining the primary colors red and yellow. Adding more reds, or yellows, or black, or gray, or white will change the different hues of orange.



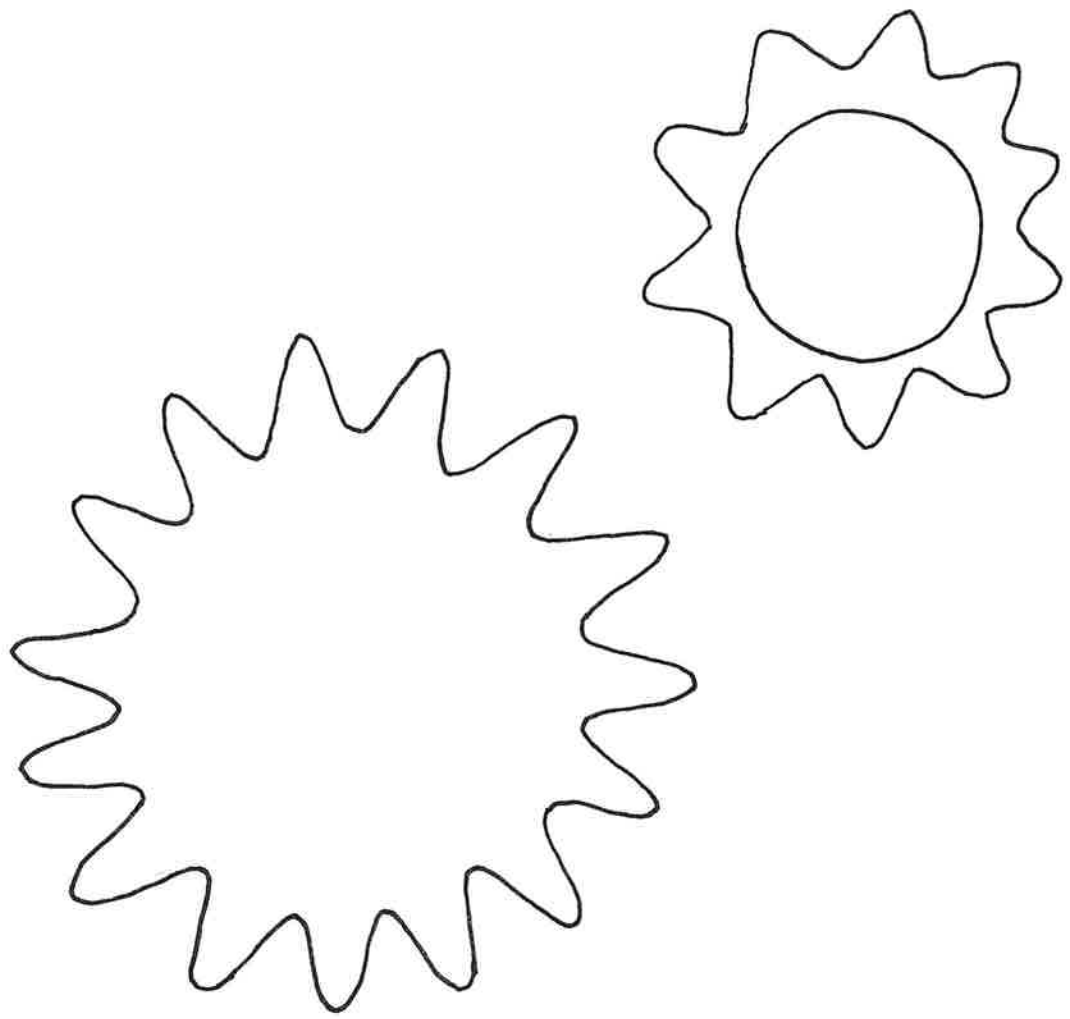

Your Art Class Knocks on Wood

The woodpecker is an unusual bird from the picidae family. There are many different types of woodpeckers but the one thing they have in common is their ability to repeatedly peck or hammer wood looking for insects to eat. Engineers have even studied woodpeckers in motion to determine how their skulls are not damaged by their continual hammering. The most notable of the woodpeckers is the largest, the pileated woodpecker with the large red cone on top and measuring 16 to 19 inches long. The famous cartoon character, Woody Woodpecker, is modeled after the pileated Woodpecker.

Copy one of the black and white beginning or completed drawings of the pileated woodpecker on cardstock. Or create your own woodpecker character.

Music Suggestion: The theme song from the Woody Woodpecker Show was written by Ramay Idriss and George Tibbles. It was recorded in 1948 by Kay Keyser with Gloria Wood and a memorable laugh by Harry Babbit. Although it did not win, the song was the first song from an animated feature to be nominated for an Academy Award. Many people have since recorded it so try them: Glenn Miller and Orchestra, Andrew Sisters, and Kate Smith.

Enrichment: Watch a Woody Woodpecker cartoon. Walter Lantz (1899-1994) and Ben Hardaway (1895-1957) created the mischievous character. Walter Lantz illustrated his book: "How to Draw: Woody Woodpecker and Friends." National Geographic has some great videos to watch about woodpeckers: "Woodpeckers verses the World" about the hoarding acorn woodpecker and "Miracle of Woodpeckers" about the pileated woodpecker.

Aspect of Art: **Artistic License:** The artists' right to apply imagination to familiar things and ideas.
